



Jobs online quarterly report September 2019

The [Jobs Online](#) data for the last quarter is now available on our website.

Overview of key trends for September 2019

- Online job advertisements increased by 0.3 per cent in the September 2019 quarter, compared to the June 2019 quarter's fall of 1.4 per cent. Job advertisements over the year, since September 2018, fell by 1.0 per cent.
- At the industry level, the overall increase in job advertisements for the September 2019 quarter was as a result of increases in the Sales, Business services, Primary and Education industries. Over the year, IT was the only industry to increase.
- The two occupation groups where the increase in online advertising over the quarter and year was greatest were Community & personal services and Labourers.
- Over the quarter and the year to September 2019, the biggest increase in online advertisements by broad skill level groupings was for Unskilled occupations.
- Over the quarter, the main growth areas were in Nelson/Tasman/Marlborough/West Coast, Waikato and Wellington. Over the year, Gisborne/Hawke's Bay and Wellington were the main growth regions, partially offsetting the decreases in Northland, Canterbury and Auckland.
